

# Patterns for Torah Art Cut-outs

**Grade level:** Preschool-2<sup>nd</sup>

**Description:**

Use these different Torah-related patterns to embellish Shavuos projects, Shanah Tovah cards, Sukkos decorations, etc. The idea is to fold a paper in half and then create paper cuts of a Sefer Torah, luchos, bikkurim, and a Yerushalayim scene among other pictures.

**Goals/objectives:**

Students will reinforce their fine motor coordination and create paper cuts which relate to relevant material.

**Materials needed:**

- patterns of paper cuts
- paper, white or colored
- scissors
- crayons or markers to color in and decorate

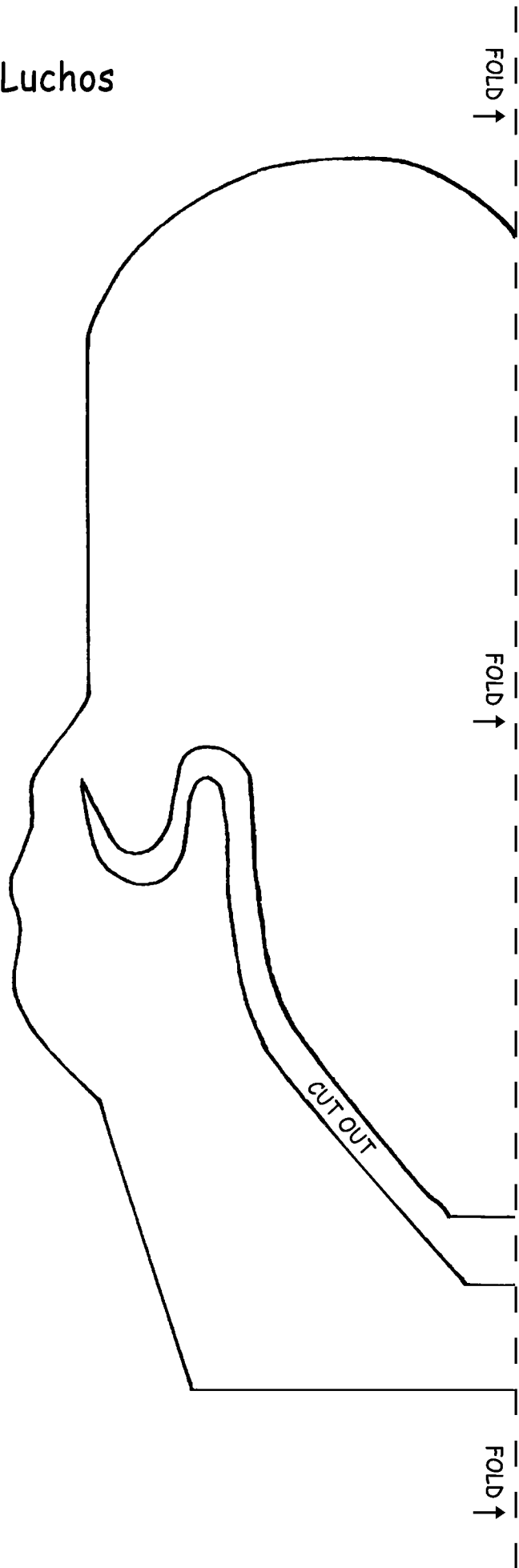
**Instructions:**

1. Trace the pattern onto a paper. (Alternately, the pattern could be photocopied onto the paper that you want to use. This would eliminate the tracing step.)
2. Fold the paper in half.
3. Cut along designated lines.
4. Unfold the paper to reveal the paper cut.
5. Color in and decorate paper cut if desired.
6. Use paper cut to adorn projects or to stand alone.

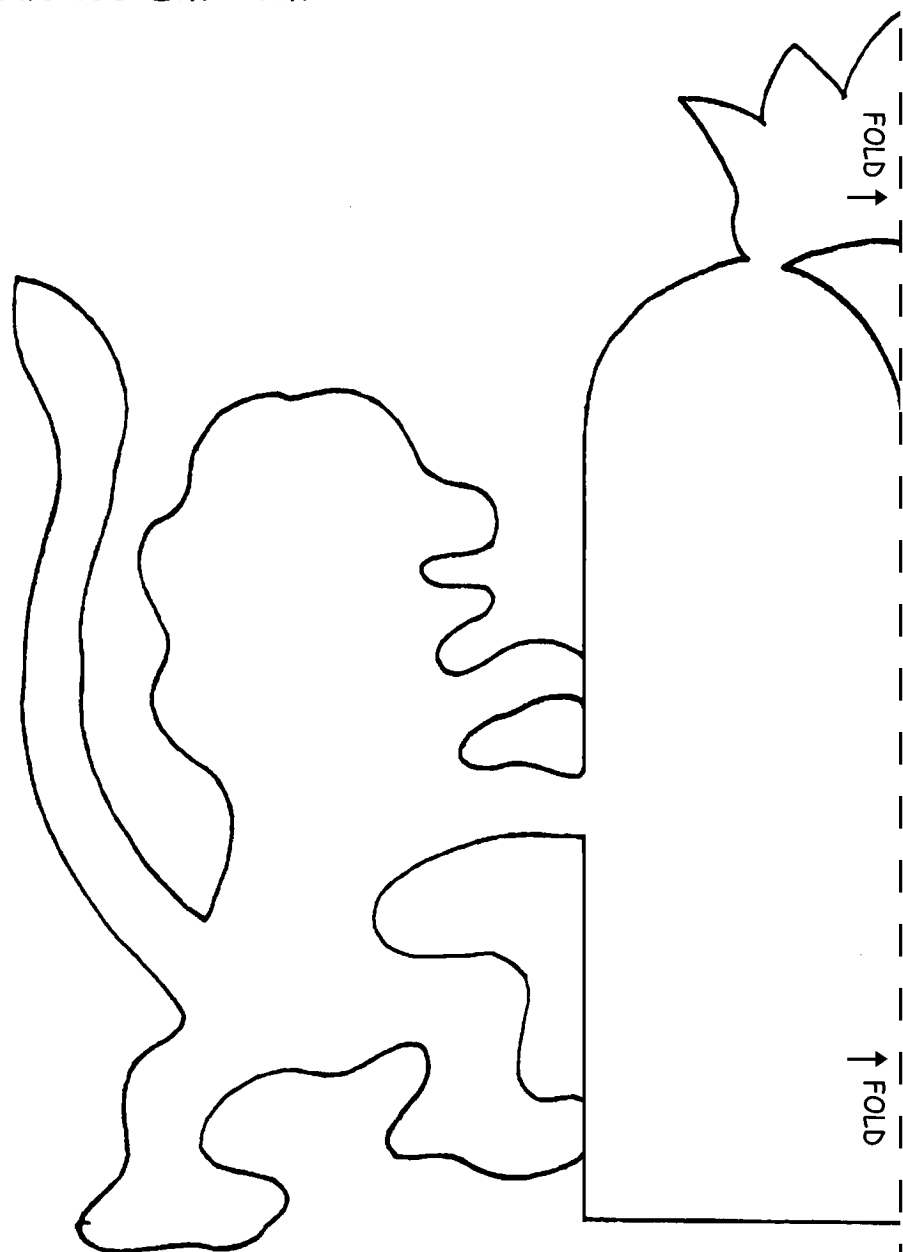
**Variations:**

Laminate the decorated paper cuts and hang in classroom as decorations.

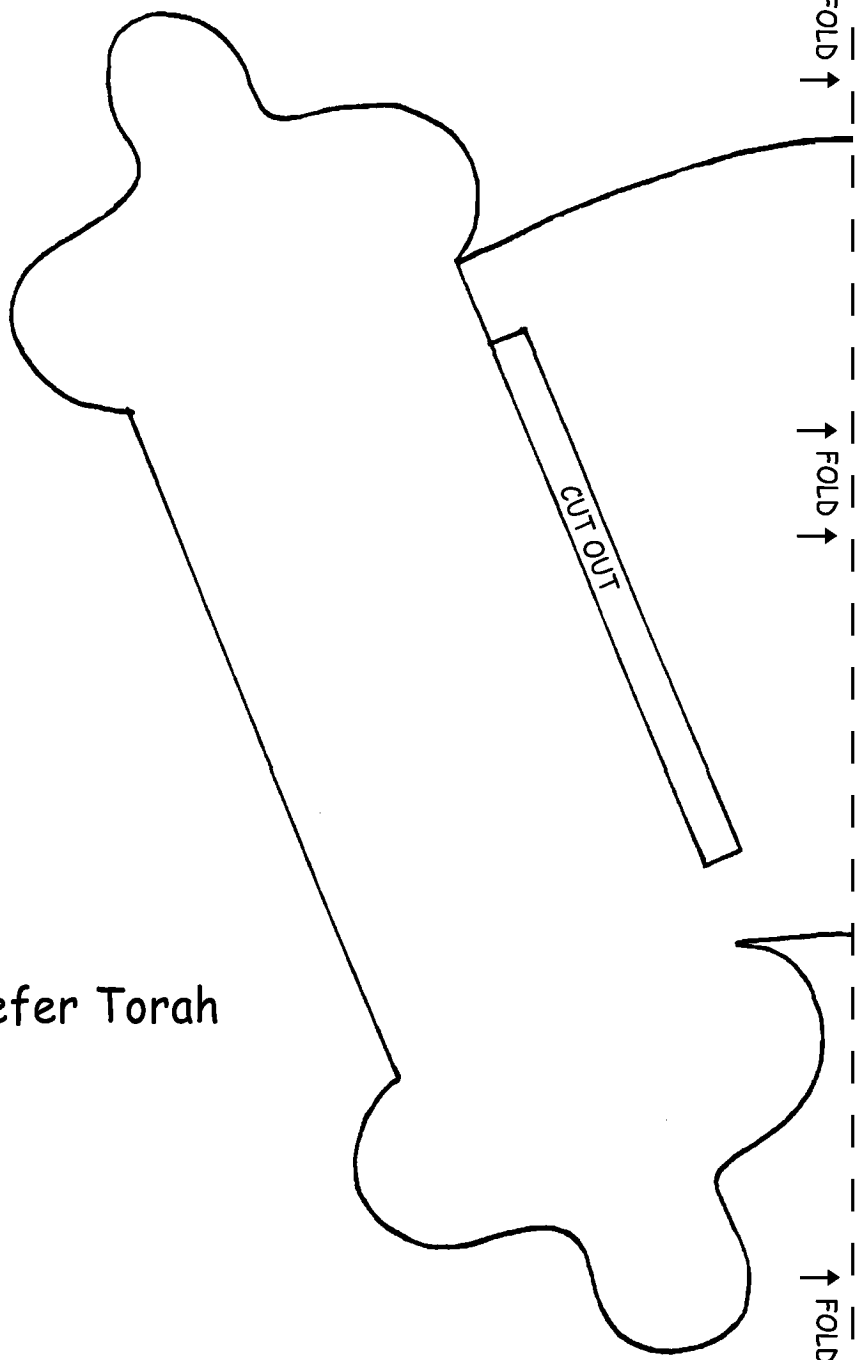

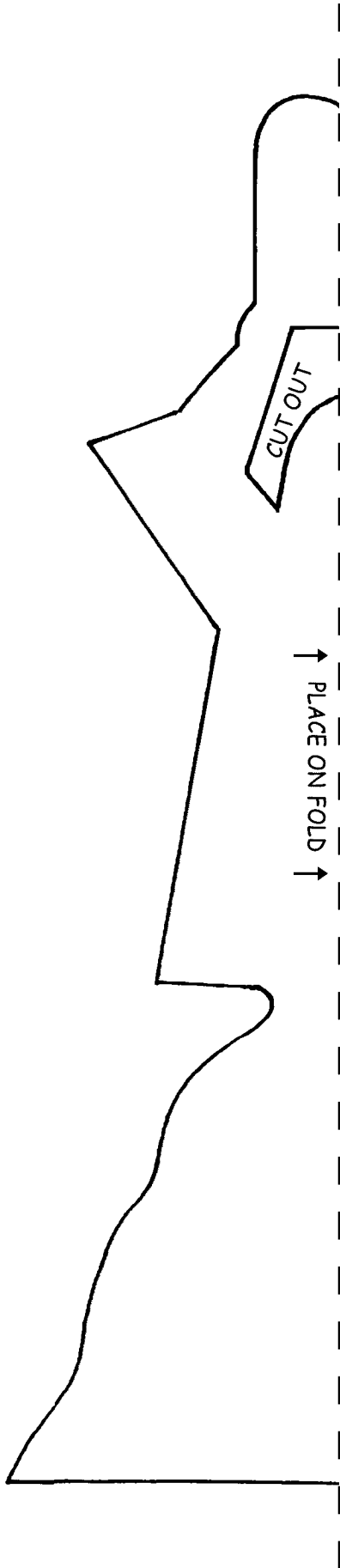
# Luchos Emblem



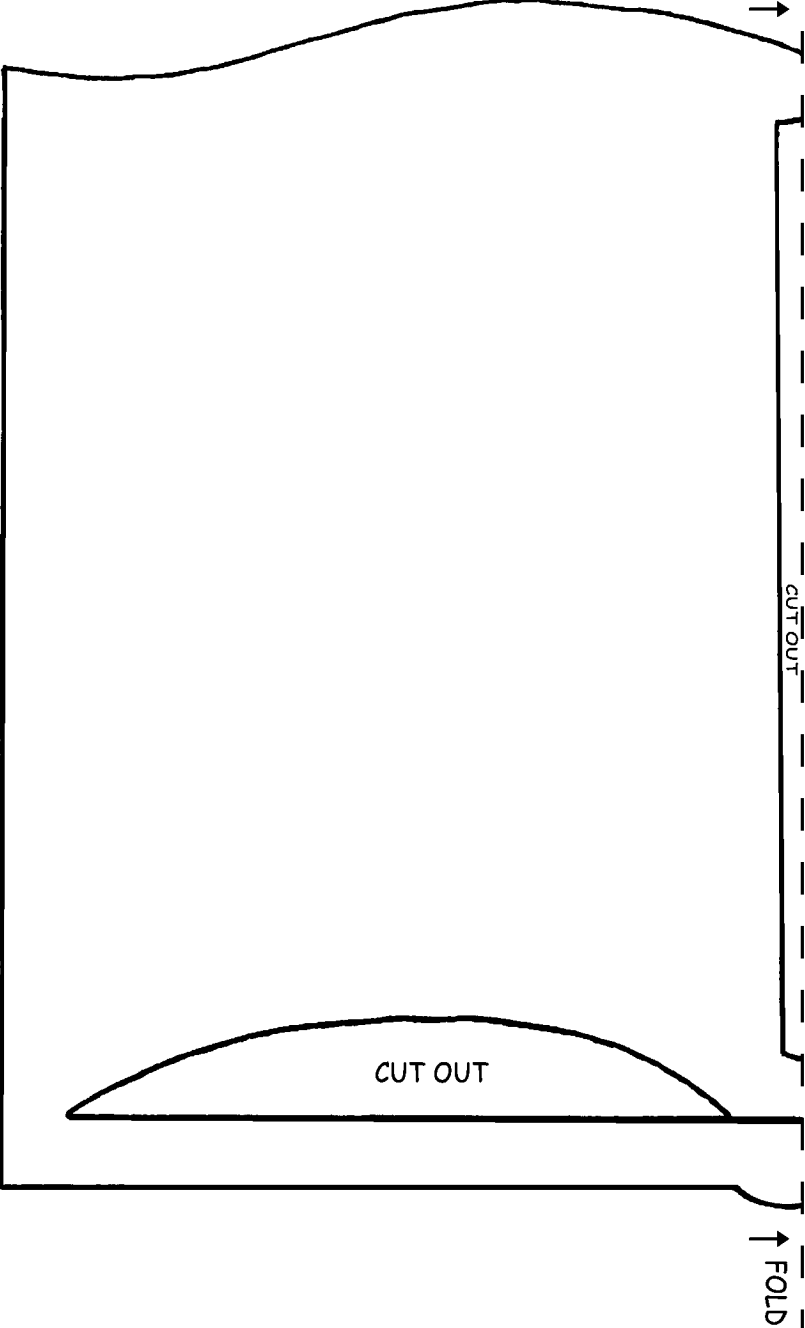
Sefer Torah



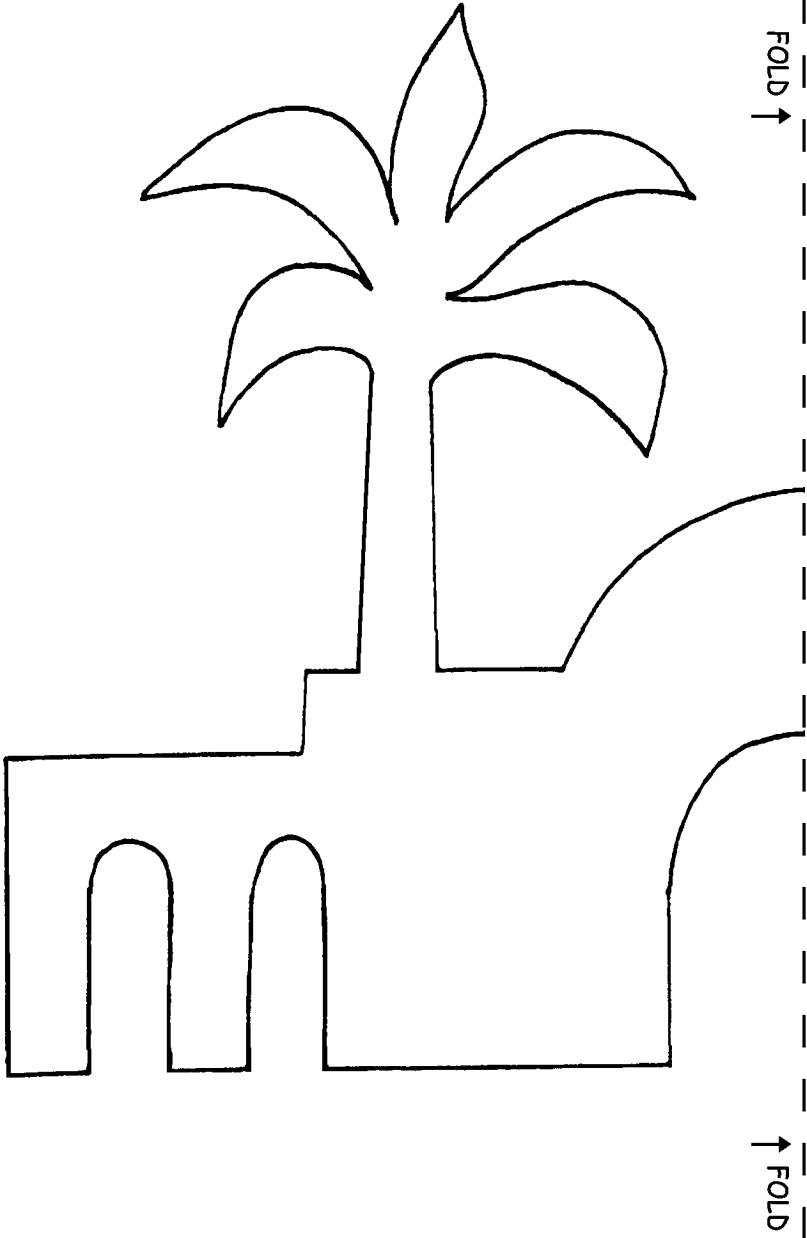
Moshe on  
Mt. Sinai



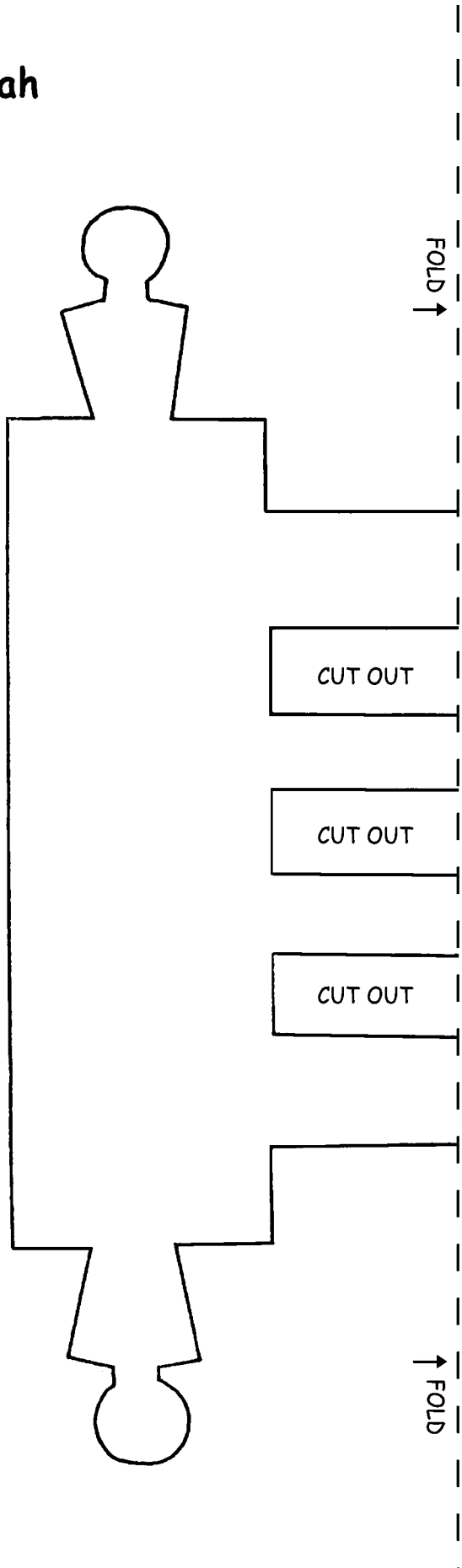

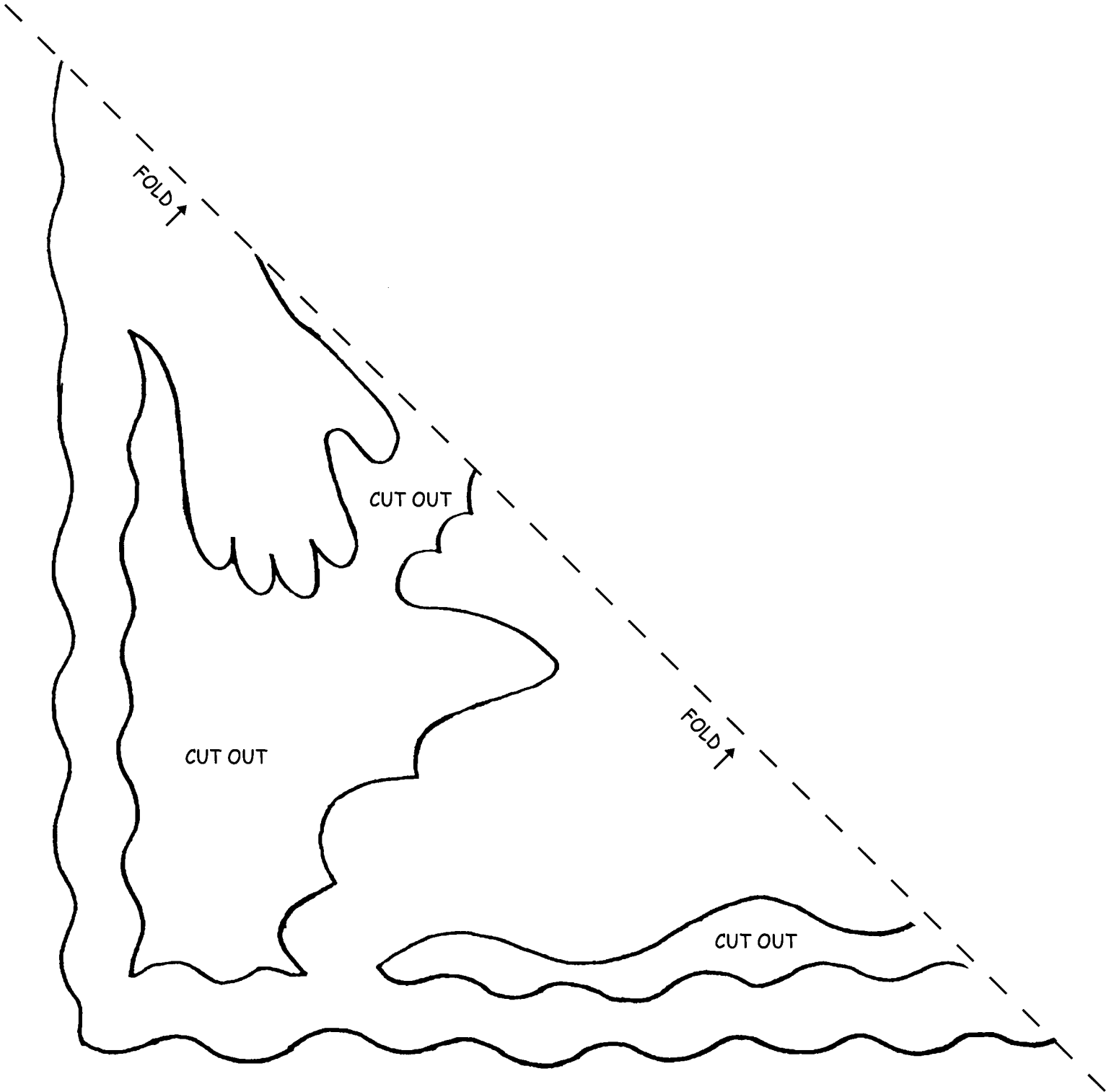
