

# Borei Pri Hagafen Pendant for Wine Bottles

**Grade Level:** Early Childhood, Elementary

**Description:**

This item features Borei Pri Hagafen pendant templates for wine and grape juice bottles! The template displays the words, “Borei Pri Hagafen” in Hebrew and is illustrated with a wine bottle flanked by two wine glasses. Use it to review the Bracha Rishona of Borei Pri Hagafen or as part of a Shabbos unit.

What to download

- Download the print-ready PDF file (includes lesson plan/instructions).

**Goals/Objectives:**

Students will create a necklace for grape juice or wine bottles using the provided pendant template to review the Bracha of Borei Pri Hagafen or to review the Mitzva of Kiddush on Shabbos.

**Materials Needed:**

- Coloring supplies
- Single hole punch
- String, ribbon or pipe cleaner

**Instructions:**

1. Print, photocopy and cut-out the templates.
2. Have students color in the templates.
3. Laminate (optional). This will prevent the necklace from getting soggy from condensation on cold bottles.
4. Punch a hole at the top of the template. (You can use reinforcements on either side of the hole to prevent tears. This is especially important if the pendant is not laminated.)
5. Thread a ribbon, string or pipe cleaner through the hole and knot.
6. Instruct students to place the necklace on the neck of a grape juice or wine bottle.

**Variations:**

Once the pendant is placed on the ribbon, string or pipe cleaner, have students string beads on either side to further decorate their wine/grape juice bottle necklaces!
